## **Cypress Trails Neighborhood Watch Update**

Team Introduction: over 75 years combined law enforcement and national security background

<u>What we do</u>: monitor assigned areas, identify suspicious activity, coordinate with neighbors; contact law enforcement (if needed); recommend *crime avoidance*; maintain NW accreditation

What we don't do: aggressively approach or detain; conduct investigations; carry weapons

## **Crime Status Report**

- Nocatee very low crime vs. Surrounding Areas (e.g., Southside, St. Johns Town Center)
  - <u>Note</u>: Cypress Trails Park is responsibility of CDD (call 904-576-9164 to report property damage or parking violation; or call JSO to report disturbance)
  - JSO website provides crime statistics with interactive mapping tool
  - <u>Local trends</u>? Vehicle break-ins, shoplifting, hit-and-run; many golf cart & biking accidents with underage drivers/riders (some resulting in fatalities!)
- Bigger Picture, Recent Developments:
  - JSO Sheriff T.K. Waters: tough on crime, supported by mayor & city council; visited our neighborhood with many of his staff on May 4, 2024
  - Mutual Aid Agreement between JSO & St. Johns County Sheriffs Office (e.g., 911)
  - Community-based policing works!
  - <u>National trends</u>: increased drug-related deaths, robberies, human/sex trafficking, assault, esp. w/ organized crime (e.g., MS-13, Venezuelan immigrant gangs)

### **Recommendations/Best Practices**

- Neighborhood Watch is more effective with broad participation of residents!
- Important phone numbers: emergency (911), and non-emergency JSO (904-630-0500)
- <u>Prevent crime</u> by doing following:
  - Get to know and watch out for your neighbors; be aware of surroundings!
  - Perform "9:00 routine" <u>ensure doors/windows locked</u>, outdoor lights on, etc.
  - Install Ring (similar) video doorbells, network w/security cameras & cell phones
  - Minimize parking on street, <u>always lock doors</u>; hide or remove valuables
  - Keep garage doors closed unless in use or within line-of-sight
  - Bring phone *and a friend!* on neighborhood walks
  - <u>While on vacation</u>: submit mail hold (USPS on-line), leave on porch/garage lights
    & some indoors; but *don't* leave trash bins on curb for days
  - Report street lights out to JEA (904-665-6250), or w/map-based tool on website: https://www.jea.com/manage\_my\_account/report\_an\_outage/OutageReporting/Streetlight
  - <u>Be cautious with on-line sales</u>: meet in public area along with a friend (e.g., Nocatee Visitors Center or store parking lot)

# Reporting/observation: Who, What, When, & Where -- For 911 calls, be concise!

# Example #1 – Suspicious Person Loitering:

- Who: Caucasian male, approx. 6 ft, 180-190 lb, brown hair, 30-40 yrs. old
- What: soliciting/loitering (knocking on doors, looking in windows, wandering in street)
- When: Saturday morning (mid-Feb.), around 10-10:30 AM
- Where: Gray Wolf Trail near White Marsh Dr
- Result: Tom C. notified person re: No Soliciting posted, visited NW Team Lead in person; guidance continue to observe, do not confront, call JSO non-emergency if persistent

## Example #2 – Wrecked Car:

- Who: Caucasian male, 18-19 yrs. old, lives with CT resident
- What: abandoned vehicle, driver had hit curb and wrecked front axle, possible DWI???
- When: early Saturday morning (late-Jan.)
- Where: Cypress Trails Dr adjacent to second retention pond
- Result: reported to JSO, they relayed to towing company; spoke with owner

# Example #3 – Missing Vehicle (that wasn't):

- Who: relative of neighbors that were on a cruise
- What: posted on Facebook that (company-marked) vehicle was stolen, owners away
- When: mid-March
- Where: from in front of the residence
- Result: spoke w/nearby neighbors, reviewed security cam footage, researched company, notified relative that co-worker had picked up the vehicle

### Miscellaneous

- Consider compiling voluntary database of homeowners with security cameras (???)
- Notified CDD re: two overhead lights out, on Valley Ridge off of Nocatee Pkwy. (fixed)
- Please <u>do not</u> park cars across sidewalks: blocks pedestrians w/dogs, elderly, etc.
- Be considerate and trim trees over your sidewalk (some walkers are over 6-ft tall!)
- Trash pickup: Mondays; Recycling: every other Tuesday (e.g., Oct. 1)
